## *Don't Touch!*

Some months ago I wrote an article, "Don't fondle the bidding box." It brought smiles to many, agreement from even more folks, and even a compliment or two. Now, people are suggesting I rerun that article. Well, rather than take the easy way out, permit me to offer a variable perspective - somewhat based on lines from the radio show, Fibber McGee and Molly. How many of you remember that show? Do you also remember the way it started? "Don't touch that dial. It's time for Fibber McGee and Molly." Well, my variation for our bridge mantra is, DON'T TOUCH THE BIDDING BOX TILL YOU'VE MADE UP YOUR MIND WHAT TO BID...AND THEN, SIMPLY BID IT.

It makes no difference what club I play at, there's always a Director call, and sometimes more than one, because the person whose turn it is to bid, reaches up to the top of the bids, as if to make some kind of numbered bid, and then drops his/her hand and passes. Sometimes he/she does this once, and then again, almost like a Times Square/Grand Central shuttle. Wow....what a vast amount of unauthorized information has been given to partner. Of course the Director is called...and there are rules that cover the circumstance, but, it didn't have to be that way. If it's my turn to bid, it's my obligation to think, decide what I want to do, and, instead of saying it out loud, I reach for that card in the box and display it.

It's not very hard...it just takes DISCIPLINE. Please note, I'm not asking for discipline in the bid you choose. That's a different story, and something for you and your partner to fight about, but, discipline before you even reach for the bidding box. Can you discipline yourself to ask yourself in your mind, "Am I done thinking? Am I sure what bid I want to make?" If the answer is no, then keep thinking...and thinking...and thinking, but eventually your thinking is done. Again, ask yourself, "Am I done thinking? Am I sure what bid I want to make?"

Now the answer will be yes. Reach for the bidding box with confidence and give yourself a big pat on the back....you did it right....and no matter how the bid turns out....you DID IT RIGHT...

So now we have two admonitions to focus on: (1) Don't fondle the bidding box and 2) Apply discipline and before you reach for the box ask yourself, "Am I done thinking?" - "Am I sure what bid I want to make?"

#### Points of Fact

Convention Card – you MUST have a Convention Card filled out and it must be the same as your Partner. Some people are lazy and don't 'bother' filling out a convention card. ACBL takes the hard line that if you can't take the time to fill out a Convention Card then you don't have the time to play. Additionally, it is just not fair to the opponents; they are entitled to see your Convention Card. A Director has the right to penalize a partnership for the lack of a Convention Card, especially if it harms the opponents – beware!

Dummy – Dummy cannot be the first person to call attention to an irregularity (i.e., revoke) until the hand has been played. If, however, the irregularity is pointed out by another player prior to the end of the hand, the Dummy can call the Director. Dummy can only speak at the table if the Director says it is OK.

Opening Lead out of Turn – There should never be an opening lead out of turn – always lead face DOWN; ACBL Law requires that you do so. This way, if you have lead incorrectly, you can take it back. If you lead face up incorrectly, the Director must be called and then there could be restrictions and penalties.

Looking at Held Cards – ACBL Law states that looking intently at any other player during the auction and play is a violation. Additionally, looking at “another player's hand as for the purpose of seeing his cards or of observing the place from which he draws a card” is also a violation. So, no calls please to say a person has touched a few cards (they should not be fiddling, true, but how would you know if you were not suppose to be looking).

Baseball season is here once again. Nobody yanks a bridge player the way a manager yanks an ineffective starting pitcher, but North did need some relief after today’s deal.

South took the first spade, drew trumps, cashed the ace of diamonds, ruffed a diamond and ran all his trumps. The defenders had no problem – West saved spades and East saved clubs. South went down one, and North was left wishing he could go to his bullpen.

South must have been tiring in the late innings – he’d have succeeded if West had held length in clubs as well as in spades, but that was unlikely after West had shown up with two trumps.

South gets home by playing East for length in clubs. After drawing trumps, South takes the ace of diamonds, ruffs a diamond and cashes the AKQ of clubs, discarding a spade. He next leads dummy’s last club, and when East follows, South throws another spade.

East must then lead a club or a diamond, and South discards his last spade as dummy ruffs.

Commentary – Can East bid 3♦ over 2♥? Surely this would give South the winning line-of-play. Would N/S have gotten to 6♥ if West jumped to 5♦? Is 7♦X a good sacrifice?
